What is a Neighborhood Council?

There are 99 Neighborhood Councils in Los Angeles

- Neighborhood Councils are part of the Los Angeles City government, and have annual budgets funded by taxpayer dollars. Neighborhood Council board members are City officials who are elected by the members of their local communities, but they donate their time as volunteers.
- The PRNC Board is elected by stakeholders and holds regular monthly meetings on the second Wednesday of the month. Special Meetings are sometimes called, in between the regular monthly meetings, when matters of urgency need to be addressed. Any and all meeting times, dates, locations, and agendas are always posted, on the prnc.org website, at least 72 hours in advance and often on social media.
- The PRNC board also continues to advocate for the community regarding the Aliso Canyon Gas Storage Facility. It us highly recommended that you join us at a board meeting and/or join a committee to get involved prior to running for office. Committees are focused on key issues such as:, beautification, budget & finance, education, homelessness, land use, public safety & traffic, sustainability, as well as a committee for outreach.
- All Board Meetings and Committee Meetings are currently held via Zoom until further notice.
