It is thought that the number is actually closer to 20 million due to reporting issues (especially in developing nations).

- **Cases** Over the past week, the state has averaged 4,424 new cases, a decrease of 59.4% compared to two weeks ago.
- **Deaths** 1097 total deaths have been reported over the last week, 7.6% less than two weeks ago.
- **Hospitalizations** There are 2,869 people hospitalized with a confirmed case statewide, a 47.7% decrease from two weeks ago.
- **Vaccinations** 78.7% of the state population has received at least one dose.
- **Variants** The Omicron variant now accounts for most new cases.

The rate of new cases per 100,000 residents over the last seven days provides insight into where the virus is spreading.

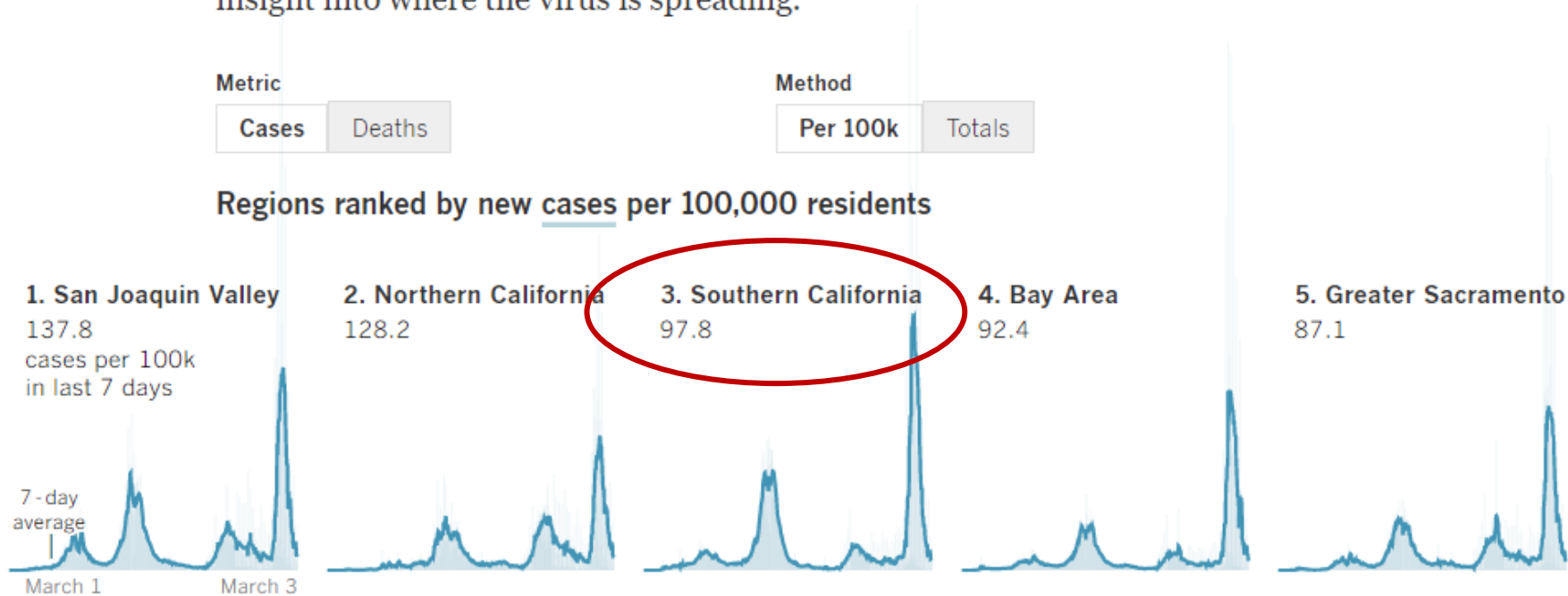

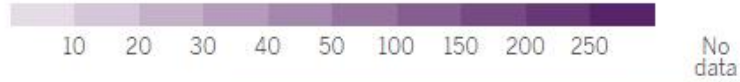

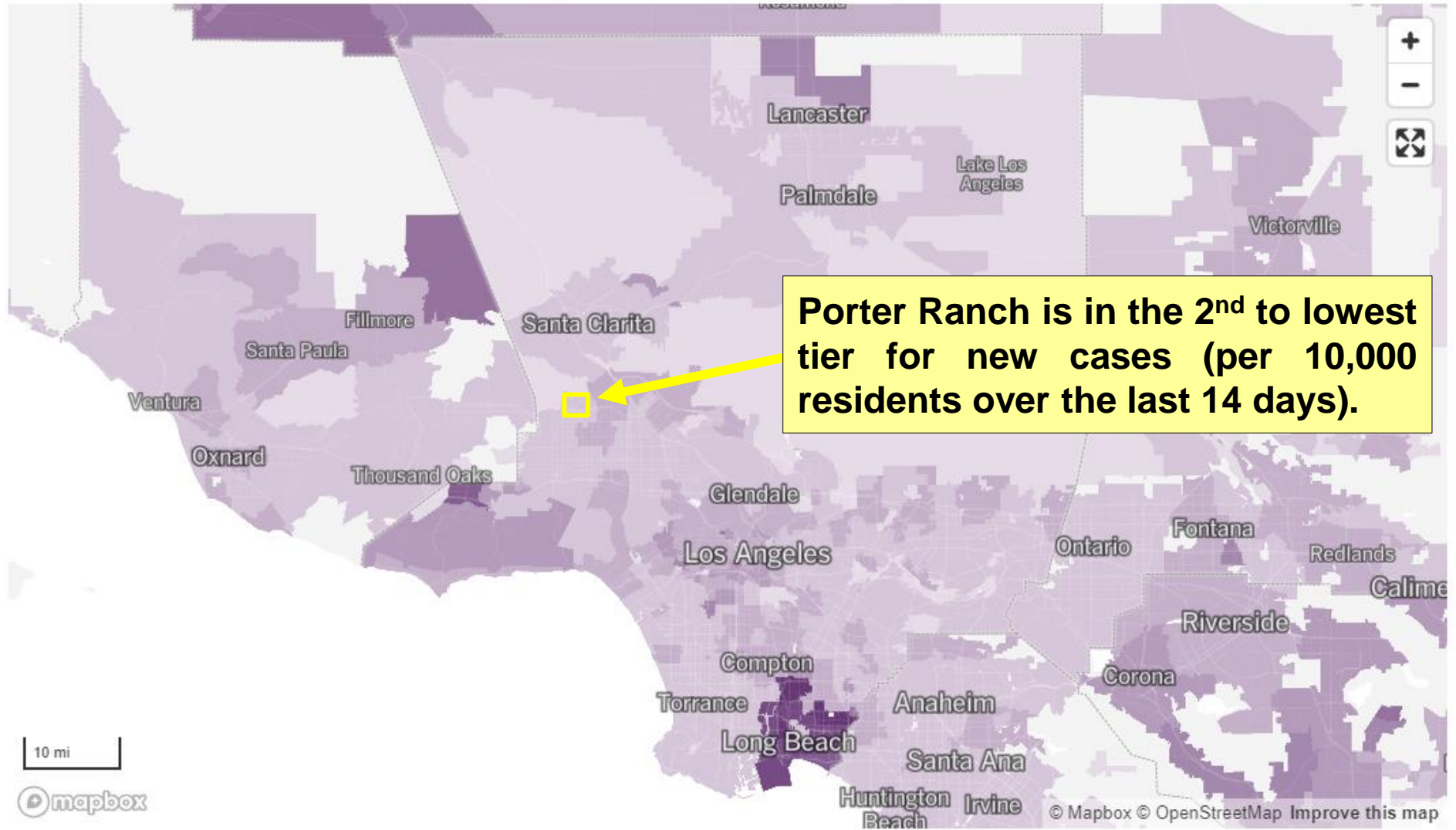


Cases per 10,000 residents over last 14 days

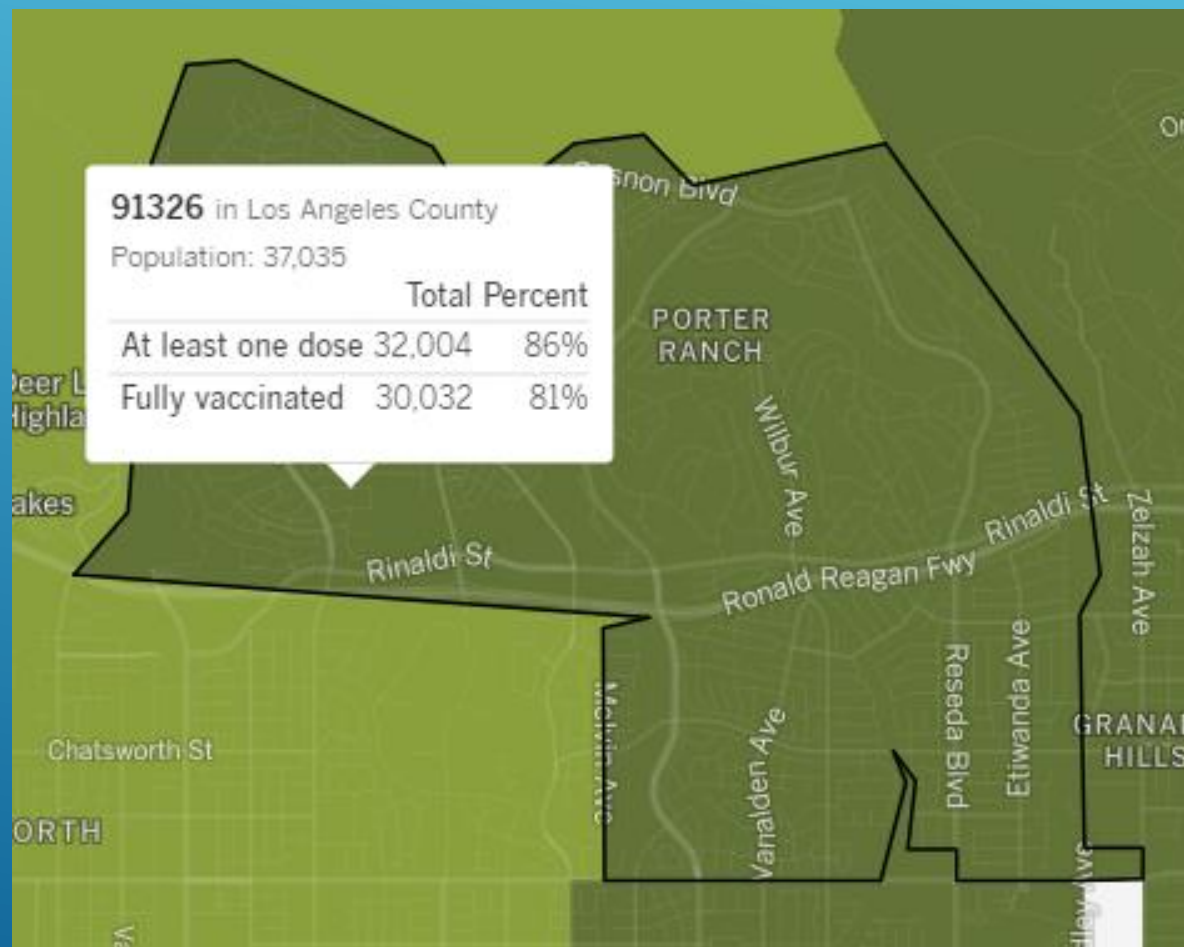

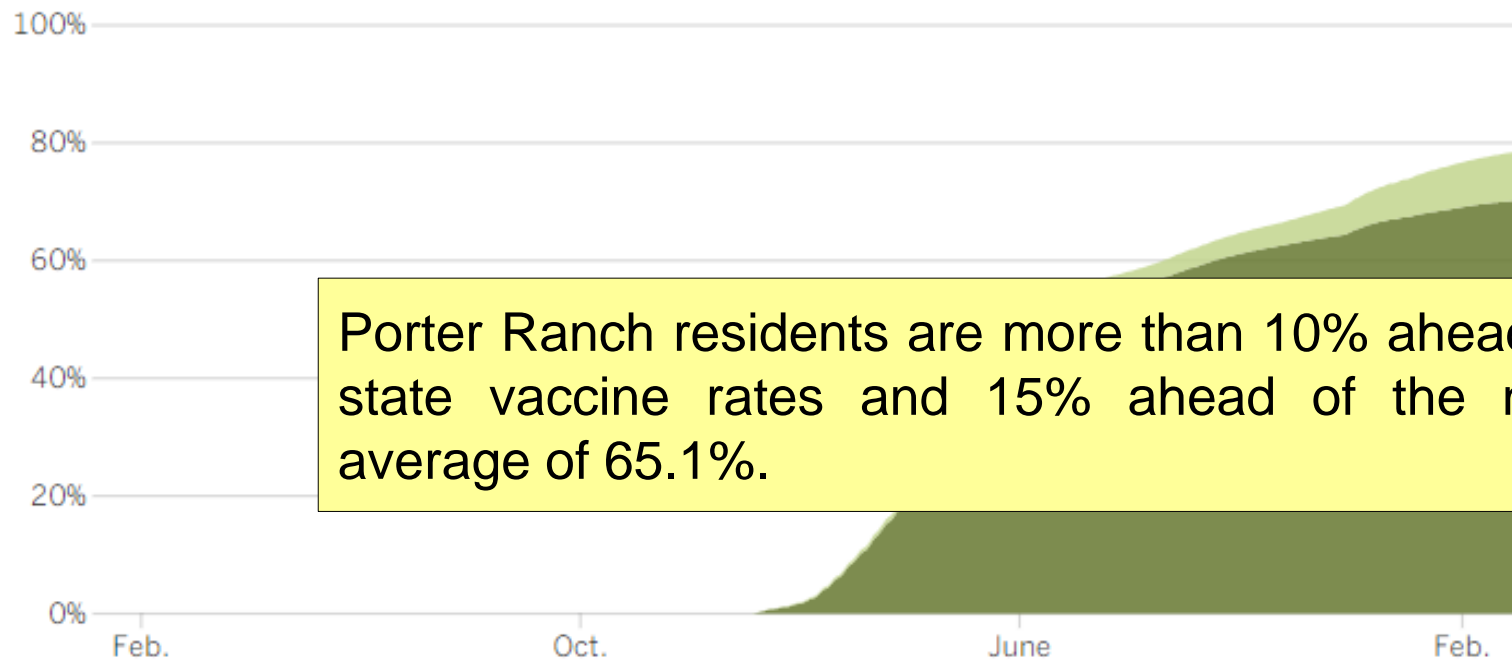
- 86% of Porter Ranch residents have had at least one dose of one of the three vaccines.
- 81% are fully vaccinated.



So far, 78.6% of Californians have received at least one dose, about 30.8 million people.

Among all Californians, 70.2% are fully vaccinated, meaning they have either received both shots of Pfizer or Moderna or the single-dose Johnson & Johnson vaccine.

Porter Ranch residents are more than 10% ahead of the state vaccine rates and 15% ahead of the national average of 65.1%.
